DO YOU NEED<br>A BUILDING PERMIT?

Permits are not required for common types of home repair, such as:

- Siding
- Painting
- Sheetrock
- Above-ground pools under 24 inches
- Retaining walls under 4 feet
- Sidewalks, driveways, platforms less than 30 inches above grade.
- Fences less than 6 feet
- Other cosmetic alterations and minor interior or exterior repairs


## Permits are required for:

- An addition
- Garage
- Deck 30 inches above grade, at any point
- Roofing
- Electrical and plumbing work
- Accessory buildings over 200 sq. ft .
- In-ground swimming pools
- Above-ground pools over 24 inches
- Changing or installing a furnace or water heater, etc.
Permit fees are calculated based on the total estimated cost of construction. The estimated cost shall be included on the building permit application.

Permit Fees for new residential dwellings are based on the square foot.

Information required for a residential building permit:

- Site Plan Drawn by a Registered Surveyor (New Dwelling)
- Complete Building plans
- Contractors doing the work
- The property owner

Commercial Building Permits also require engineered plans and a site plan by a registered land surveyor in addition to the previous items.

Permits are required simply to ensure your safety and to make sure there are no life safety hazards endangering you and your family, as well as the public.
