Safety

- 1. Your structure of the vessel cannot interfere with your crew making a hasty exit if your boat sinks. Everyone must have a clear exit from the vessel.
- 2. All participants must possess the ability to swim in the event that the vessel sinks.
- 3. Participants may wear a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) during the race. You must bring and supply bring own PFD. No water wings.

Boat

- 1. Design of your boat is up to you. YOU ARE THE CAPTAIN.
- 2. The only materials you may use to build your boat include: cardboard, duct tape, adhesive, and <u>water-based</u> paint.
- 3. Only cardboard, or corrugated cardboard may be used. Cardboard may not have any wax, resin, or vinyl coating.
- 4. Wood, plastic or plastic wrap, fiberglass, metal, styrofoam, or other materials that would aid in floatation or make the boat more rigid are prohibited.
- 5. Duct or clear tape, liquid nail adhesive, and contact or cement are ok.
- 6. Tar, wax, silicone, fiberglass resins, epoxy glues, staples, nails, clamps, and screws are prohibited.
- 7. Decorations may be made of any material but cannot help keep the boat together or afloat.
- 8. Boats may be painted, and all materials **must** be dry before the boat enters the water.
- 9. Boats are subject to inspection and may be disqualified for not meeting any one of the stated rules.

Race

- 1. Racecourse consists of DOWN & BACK at Southview Pool. (Individuals and Teams must paddle their boat down and back).
- 2. Boats can be propelled by oars, paddles or "convenient body parts". Oars or paddles may be constructed of cardboard or the real thing. No motors allowed. Participants are not allowed to get out of the boat to push or pull.
- 3. Each team can have 2-4 people.
- 4. Boats are required to stay in their lanes. Bumping, ramming, or interfering with other vessels in any manner is prohibited.

Awards & Teams

- 1. Prior to the races, boats will be judged, and prizes will be awarded for the following categories: Most Creative.
- 2. During the races, each event will be timed and awards given to the fastest time in each class. Classes consist of: 12 & under, 13-17, 18+, and Family Teams-(adults-18+ & kids-17U).
- 3. There will also be a "Titanic Award" in each class for the most spectacular sinking.

Tips for Constructing Your Boat

The most important ingredient is FUN! The Richmond Parks & Recreation Cardboard Boat Race is all about being creative and having fun. Don't forget to decorate! Even if you sink, might as well look good doing it!

Illegal waterproofing or use of floatation aids on your boat will not be allowed.

Tips:

- A. Follow construction standards and rules.
- B. Make sure you construct in an area that will allow plenty of room. There's nothing worse than doing all the building and then not being able to fit out the door!
- C. Choose a style or theme and plan your design before you start building.
- D. Build the boat bottom first.
- E. Make sure there are no holes or spaces in your boat.
- F. More folding, less cutting helps!
- G. Design a paddle method that works for you and your vessel.
- H. Name your boat, decorate, and add a flag to enhance your design. [waterproof markers and paints only]
- I. Layering cardboard helps make the design thicker and less likely to sink.
- J. Think about the weight of you or your team members. Your boat needs to be able to withstand all the weight.
- K. Give your boat plenty of time to dry before the big race.
- L. Always have an exit plan! Do not construct a boat that you could get trapped under.
- M. Use your resources! Parents and the internet make for great help!

Things to consider:

- A. Duct tape is completely waterproof and extremely durable.
- B. The longer and narrower the boat, the faster it should travel through the water.
- C. The longer and narrower your boat, the harder it is to turn.
- D. The more people on your boat, the more weight your boat has to carry.
- E. The more people on your boat, the faster you can paddle.
